## High-capacity digital storage from Delkin

Digital users frustrated by the memory limitations of the digital film currently on offer will be interested in Delkin's latest gadget, the Picture Pad. The device works like a portable hard drive, storing up to 20 or 30 gigabytes (that's 20,000 or 30,000MB) of information, which means hundreds of high-resolution or uncompressed digital images that are then displayed on an LCD screen as thumbnails or full pictures, or file names for sorting.

When you've run out of space on your digital card, you take it out, whack it in the Picture Pad, transfer your files, then put your empty card back in the camera. The stored shots can also be viewed through connection to a TV or Video Projector via the micro composite video output jack, and pictures can be reviewed as a slide show, or selected manually in order to rotate images and organise and rename files. Each unit comes with a full version of Adobe Photoshop Elements.

The 20GB version retails at £599, while the 30GB sells for £699. The Delkin Picture Pad is distributed exclusively in the UK by Prisma who can be contacted on 0844 477 0121.
